

ZERO WASTE HOLIDAY TIPS:



During the holidays, let's focus on reducing waste at your business! When planning your holiday festivities consider some of these zero waste tips:

Purchasing Gifts: If you are ordering employee gifts this year from an online retailer, consider the amount of packaging that is required for shipping. Some retailers, such as Amazon, offer "frustration-free" packaging on certain products, which reduces the amount of packaging used and ensures each component is recyclable. Another option to reduce packaging waste when ordering multiple items, is requesting that all items are packaged together. If purchasing gifts in a store, you can look for retailers that offer package-free products and don't forget your reusable shopping bag!

To reduce waste even further this year, shop locally, opt for homemade gifts, or, gift experiences, subscriptions, or services instead of a physical gift such as a museum visit, a trip to your favorite restaurant, or movie and theatre tickets.

Holiday Décor: Aim for reusable or natural décor items within your office. For lighting, utilize LED string lights on trees or outdoor decorating which are reusable and have a long lifespan. For other decorations, invest in durable, reusable

pieces or compostable natural decorations such as pinecones, real foliage, fruits, and vegetables.

Waste Disposal: Be mindful of your indoor compost, recycle, and landfill waste stations during holiday parties or events. Larger events produce more waste and ensuring proper waste sorting and management is required. Consider designating a Zero Waste Champion to monitor waste stations during events and provide guidance to the rest of your team when needed. STOP THE OVERFLOW!

Overflow material is defined as any material surpassing the capacity of the refuse containers. This includes materials placed on top or next to the containers, or materials that prevent the lids of the containers from closing fully. Overflowing material is a City Municipal Code violation and a health and safety issue as it can lead to litter, attract pests, and fall onto the truck, driver, people passing by, and other surroundings during service. WHAT PACKAGING IS RECYCLABLE?

Products ordered online are often delivered with excessive amounts of packaging material, especially during the holidays. To ensure packaging materials go into the correct container, follow these general guidelines:

Recyclable items include:

- Cardboard
 - Break down and flatten prior to disposal

straws, ceramic plates, and bulk coffee grounds. Instead of buying singleuse plastic water bottles, provide a water filter, encourage reusable water bottles, or install a water filling station.

Ask vendors to take back

packaging: Communicate your commitment to sustainability with your vendors and request they change their shipping methods to reduce the waste or take back packaging they send you.

Establish a Zero Waste

Team: Select a team of employees to help monitor your company's waste and report changes to help improve waste sorting.

*Did you know state law requires businesses to prohibit employees from placing organic waste into landfill containers, periodically inspect compost containers for contamination, and notify employees if containers are contaminated?
